HOUSE



BANKING BILL

The House will finally take up the Senate's bipartisan banking bill (S. 2155) with a vote as early as Tuesday. No changes will be made to the version that cleared the Senate back in March. Passage is expected.



OTHER VOTES

Before departing for recess, members will try to finish its work on the FY 2019 defense reauthorization bill (H.R. 5515). The House may also take another shot at the 2018 farm bill, which was rejected by the chamber last week.

SENATE



NOMINATION VOTE

There will be a cloture vote at 5:30 p.m. today on the nomination of Dana Baiocco to be a commissioner of the Consumer Product Safety Commission.



VETERANS BILL

The Senate is expected to take up consideration of S.2372, which would allow veterans to obtain health care outside of the Department of Veterans Affairs.

CFIUS BILL

On Tuesday, the House Financial Services Committee and Senate Banking Committee will mark up their respective versions of the *Foreign Investment Risk Review Modernization Act*, which would overhaul CFIUS and strengthen the government's ability to review certain outbound foreign investments.
