This interactive program uses hypotheticals to explore: lawyers' dealings with tribunals (including the obligation to disclose unfavorable facts, unfavorable case law and unpublished case law); lawyers' courtroom and deposition behavior; judges' conflicts of interest based on personal and professional relationships with litigants and lawyers; judge selection and disqualification; judicial bias; judicial ethics based on conduct (including involvement in religious activities and discriminatory organizations); and judges' communications (about their cases, other judges' cases and public policy issues).
