Conflicts Between Lawyers and Their Clients: Part I

This interactive program uses hypotheticals to explore situations in which lawyers' interests might conflict with their clients' interests, including: the applicability of ethics rules to lawyers' non-legal activities; doing business with clients; accepting gifts from clients; lawyers' other duties to clients (such as serving on client boards of directors or as public officials); lawyers' relationships with other lawyers (friendships and family relationships); lawyers' other personal interests (such as in-house lawyers' wrongful termination claims, and disagreements about public policy matters); and lawyers' romantic and sexual relationships with clients.
