Ethics Issues Facing Corporate Counsel: Part II (Hiring for the Law Department, and Preserving Confidences)

This interactive program uses hypotheticals to explore conflicts of interests principles facing in-house lawyers, and their duty to preserve their corporate clients' confidences, including: (1) the conflicts risks of hiring lawyers and non-lawyers (such as disqualification principles' application to law departments and "secondment" arrangements); (2) in-house lawyers' personal conflicts; and (3) in-house lawyers' duty to protect their client's confidences by maximizing attorney-client privilege and work product protection for intra-corporate communications and when dealing with third parties.
